



Wine of the Week

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2007 Bodega Chacra "32" Pinot Noir, Patagonia (£49.50, 12.5%, Lea & Sandeman, 0207 244 0522, www.londonfinewine.co.uk). You might gulp at the prospect of paying nearly £50 for a bottle of Pinot Noir from Argentina of all places, but this is very special indeed. It comes from a tiny vineyard planted in cool climate Patagonia in 1932, and it's one of the greatest Pinots produced in the southern hemisphere: silky, aromatic and elegant with fine tannins and a long, stylish finish. So good it could be a Burgundian Grand Cru.
